In the Middle

Another Wilson County department head said this to me recently about our Library. "My department," he said, "sees the people who need our specialized services, but your department sees everyone. The library is in the middle of everything." Well, it certainly feels like it, not only because of who we serve, but recently because of where we are, or at least, where our Main Library is – on the same block that is undergoing a radical transformation.

In December of 2020, the two eight-story BB&T towers were demolished right next door. We met with experts beforehand to learn if the implosion would pose a threat to the 1939 section of our building a few hundred feet away, and to be assured it would not. Still, we closed the day of to protect our customers and staff by keeping them away from the area. When the dust settled, all was well.

We watched the clearing of what was left on the land and witnessed the rising of the brand-new, beautiful YMCA. We lived with the noise and dust of construction, and sometimes with strange vibrations that rattled our windows, with a sense of excitement. We prepared for the coming partnership to provide Middle School After-School programming funded by the Wilson Healthcare Foundation. We created a Teen Room and two Study Rooms in addition to our Maker Space to have the room and the technologies, many of them grant-funded, to support the innovative programming our young people need.

The new parking garage is nearly completed next door, and ground has been broken for the new combination residential and retail buildings beyond it – residential above, retail below. The entire block will be brand new except for the Main Library, built in 1939, added onto in the seventies and again in 2005. Like the City of Wilson, our Main Library building is a comfortable mix of the new and the old, a metaphor in brick of how we travel confidently into the future without abandoning the past.

With a Main Library firmly grounded in a city block undergoing sweeping changes, the Wilson County Public Library has a presence beyond the city limits with branches located in Elm City, Black Creek, Lucama, and Stantonsburg, as well as the East Branch in east Wilson. Our bookmobile currently travels to Sims, Saratoga, and Rockridge while we investigate future stops to bring us into underserved areas to the east for our new, grant-funded bookmobile due to arrive in early 2023. We are exploring adding smart lockers to allow customers to pick up requested items outside of our regular hours and outside of our buildings. We have received grant funds to put tablets into the hands of the elderly and homebound to connect them to the Internet, to their families, and to our library programs and services. We continue to provide programs virtually out of a newly refurbished "studio," also grant-funded, as well as welcoming our customers back into our buildings for in-person programs.

All of this is happening because of where we are, in an environment that values and supports public library service through local funding, grants, Friends, and volunteers. Yes, we are in the middle of things in more ways than one. And in Wilson County, that is exactly where we want to be.
















On Site Book Sales at Casita the month of March was a huge hit! Thank you again for your book donations.
